Online test – preparation guide

To be ready for the online test, you must prepare in advance:

Mini-portfolio

Assemble a maximum of 3 pages with examples of your own work. Your examples must show us, what you are interested in, and what you like to work with. What are your abilities and your fields of interest?

Display your work in any way you like. Use drawings, collages, or other visual formats. Also feel free to use photos of models, artefacts, objects or functional products. Or examples of things designed digitally. Insert titles and short, explanatory texts. Avoid too long texts and mind maps.

If you wish, you can use AI to assist you during your process, but the final objects/pieces and drawings must be made by you.

We will review and assess your portfolio on a large screen, so please miximize the use of your 3 pages.

Submission

PDF. Max. 10 MB in a separate file to be uploaded during the online test.

File name: portfolio.

Please note that all submissions during the online test must be anonymous. This means that your name must not appear anywhere, neither in the portfolio nor in the file name.

Your material must relate to the Crafts in Glass and Ceramics programme. Below is a link where you can read about its vision, content, etc.:
