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#### 1.1 Facts about The Faroe Islands

The Faroe Islands is located in the northeast Atlantic between Scotland, Norway and Iceland (see fig. 1).

The Faroe Islands is an archipelago of 18 mountainous islands characterized by steep cliffs, green hills and long, narrow fjords.

People live on 17 of the islands<sup>1</sup>.

The population is 51.312 (December 2018)<sup>2</sup>.

40% of the population live in the capital Tórshavn<sup>3</sup>. The capital is marked on fig. 3.

The second largest town is Klaksvík with a population of  $4.717 (2017)^4$ . Klaksvík is marked on fig. 3.

It is easy to get from island to islands as 85% of the population is connected by road<sup>5</sup>.

The islands are connected by bridges and tunnels - two of them are subsea tunnels.

It is not possible to get further than five kilometres from the ocean<sup>6</sup>.


A 11,2 km long sub-sea tunnel is currently being constructed which will improve the connection between the capital and the other towns (see fig. 2). It is due to be finished in 2020.

Distance from site to Klaksvík: 10 minutes drive by car.

Distance from site to Tórshavn: 45 minutes drive by car. When the new sub-sea tunnel is completed it will take approximately 25 minutes.







#### 1.3 Population 1997




The red lines indicate the lines from 2017.

#### 1.4 Population 2007




The red lines indicate the lines from 2017.

#### **1.5 Population 2017**




The red lines indicate the numbers from 2007. Compared to 2007 there are more people in the age group 60+.


The numbers show that the largest group is 50 - 54 and 10 - 14.


